Water System Scholarship

Operating Rules

- I. Scholarship
 - a. This scholarship shall be known as the Colorado Backflow Prevention Association Water System Scholarship or the CBPA Water System Scholarship.
 - b. The purpose of this scholarship is to:
 - i. Assist water systems within the State of Colorado to develop cross-connection control programs.
 - ii. Promote and advocate American Backflow Prevention Association (ABPA) Tester and Specialist Certifications.
 - c. This scholarship may be awarded one time each calendar year at the discretion of the CBPA.
 - d. This scholarship is co-sponsored by CBPA and Amerimid Consulting Services Corporation (ACSC).
- II. Water Systems
 - a. The water systems eligible for this scholarship shall:
 - i. Have a Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) issued Public Water System Identification (PWSID) Number.
 - ii. Be included on a list provided by CDPHE of water systems within the State of Colorado that have been noted to be in non-compliance with Article 12 of the Colorado Primary Drinking Water Regulations (Regulations).
 - iii. Be selected for award of the scholarship at the arbitrary, sole discretion of CBPA.
 - b. The water system receiving the scholarship must employ at least one person, the designee, who would be responsible for overseeing, or be involved in operating, a cross-connection control program for the system. The system must agree to send said designee through the training as provided by this scholarship.
 - c. The water system must pay for the ABPA Tester Certification or Specialist test prior to the designee attending the training.
 - d. The water system or the designee must provide transportation to the place of lodging, to and from the training site daily, and to and from the test site at the completion of the training program.
 - e. The water system must agree that CBPA and ACSC may publish the details of the scholarship award in advertising, newsletters, magazines and electronic media as well as television and radio. Photographs collected during the class are the sole property of CBPA and ACSC and may be used for advertising purposes by CBPA and ACSC.
- III. The Colorado Backflow Prevention Association, in conjunction with Amerimid Consulting Services Corporation, will provide:
 - a. Lodging in the vicinity of the training site for six nights, and
 - b. Tuition for the 40 hour training program at ACSC, and
 - c. Educational materials as utilized in the training program at ACSC.
- IV. Indemnification
 - a. The Colorado Backflow Prevention Association and Amerimid Consulting Services Corporation shall not be responsible for the successful completion of the training program or the certification test by the designee. CBPA and ACSC shall only be responsible for providing the items and services listed in Section III above.
